New & Noteworthy

KIVA MICROLOANS

IN 2021, The City of Tacoma asked Spaceworks to pilot a new microloan program with Kiva, offering 0% interest loans ranging from \$1,000 to \$15,000. We were the first Kiva hub in the Pacific Northwest and the program raised \$111,000 in its first six months for 17 local businesses.



BLACK BUSINESS ACCELERATOR

This new program prepared Black-owned businesses for new commercial spaces coming to Hilltop. In addition to a 6-week training program, participants also worked with a dedicated accountant, business coach, photographer, and marketing professional.

STAR BAZAAR

Who better than Spaceworks to activate the rooftop of a parking garage in downtown Tacoma? Instead of our annual gala event, we invited 50+ alumni to showcase their talents in our inaugural outdoor market. Art, business, and community... Spaceworks at its best!

Changes & Challenges

- Closing the 950 Gallery (due to increased rent) after 4 years and 23 exhibits
- Responding to broken storefront windows and mural vandalism, especially Nori Kimura's RBG Tribute on Commerce St
- Canceling our annual gala CACHET due to COVID-19

What to Expect in 2022

- Updating our website
- Releasing a mural cost-estimating toolkit
- Creating a new strategic plan, having completed our previous 5-year plan
- Bringing back CACHET in spring 2022 and Star Bazaar in the summer

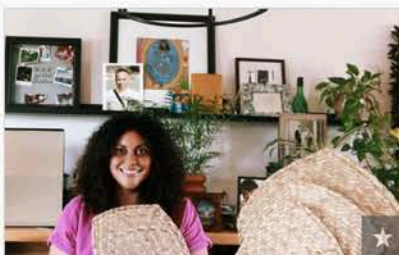

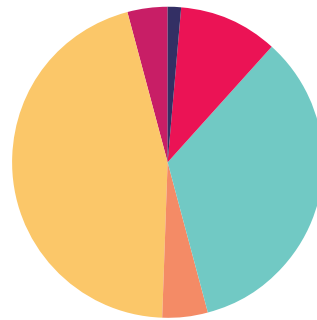
